For every slide, run these five checks:

- Was every symbol on this slide defined before I used it? (Watch y , the weight function, any new notation.)
- Did I say it out loud correctly, or did I misread a subscript or an accent? (W_x is not “w sub x”; Prüfer needs the umlaut.)
- Was the statement precise? (Quantifiers, hypotheses, “exactly n ” versus “at most n ,” index ranges, $\mathbb{R}$ as a set versus “real.”)
- Did I spend the right amount of time here, or rush or drag?
- What would I cut, add, or reorder?
